





Mae Jemison was a \*NASA astronaut and was the first \*African-American woman to go to \*space. Jemison was born in 1956. She was interested in science when she was a little girl. She spent a lot of time in the library during her school days. She loved to read books about space and dreamed about going to space someday. [ A ]

Jemison became a student at a famous university in the U.S. when she was only sixteen. She was one of the youngest students there. At that time, ( ) women or African-American people went to university. So, she sometimes had a hard time at the university.

After her graduation, Jemison decided to go to another university in the U.S. to be a doctor. During her years there, she went to a \*refugee camp in Thailand and helped people. After her graduation from the university in 1981, she [ as a doctor / working / started / in ] \*Los Angeles. In 1983, she joined a group and went to Africa as a \*medical officer. She returned to the U.S. in 1985. She thought it was time to use her \*knowledge and experience to become an astronaut. [ B ]

Jemison was chosen as a \*science mission specialist for NASA, and with six other astronauts, she went to space on September 12, 1992. She did \*experiments for about eight days in space. After her flight to space, she thought everyone should \*follow their dreams. 【 C 】

Taiga: I went to Utsunomiya City with my family last week.

Chiaki: That's nice. How was it?

Taiga: It was very good and I ate *gyoza* there. They were very delicious. The *gyoza* I ate there were very different from the ones I make at home. After eating *gyoza*, we took the \*LRT. That's my favorite memory.

Lisa: The LRT? What is that?

Taiga: The LRT is a kind of \*streetcar. It has a lower floor than most streetcars, and makes less \*noise. It is not difficult to get on the LRT because there are no \*steps.

Chiaki: Wow, I want to take it, too.

Lisa: Me too. The news I watched last night said that there are other new kinds of \*public transportation.

Chiaki: I heard there are plans for \*self-driving buses in Japan.

Lisa: Why don't we \*do research on new kinds of public transportation?

Taiga: That sounds good. Let's do it.

Taiga: I've done some research on the LRT in Utsunomiya City. The LRT began \*operation in 2023.

Lisa: So, the LRT is guite new! Tell me more about it.

Taiga: The company set up about twenty stops for the LRT. Now, it has become easier for people to go to Utsunomiya Station or other famous places in the city. The company plans to \*extend the LRT. It plans to begin operation of the extended line around 2030.

Chiaki: I see. By the way, has the \*population of Utsunomiya City grown because of the LRT?

Taiga: Yes. Actually, the population of Utsunomiya City continued to grow for three years until 2018.

Lisa: For three years!

Taiga: The company showed the LRT plan in 2016. People were happy to hear of it, and some of them decided to live in the \*LRT service area. A new elementary school opened two years before the LRT began operation, too.

Lisa: That's amazing! I think that the LRT has brought many \*changes to people and the city.

### (Chiaki talks about another kind of public transportation.)

Chiaki: I did some research on self-driving buses in Japan. They are already used in some areas.

Taiga: Oh, really? I'm surprised that there are areas which already have those buses in operation. \*Technology is always improving, isn't it? I'm \*looking forward to seeing [ change / lives / will / how / our ] in the future.

Lisa: That's true. But why are those buses running in the area?

Taiga: I think there are not enough bus drivers.

Chiaki: Yeah, that's why self-driving buses are used. Instead of a bus driver, a staff member rides the bus. The staff member is on the bus for \*emergencies. If something happens, such as an earthquake, the staff member will control the bus by using something like a video game controller. In the future, when self-driving technology is \*fully developed, drivers or staff members won't need to be on the bus. However, it may take time to develop such self-driving technology.

Taiga: By the way, where are the self-driving buses running?

Chiaki: They are running in areas with a large \*elderly population. Some people say they are happy to have a bus stop near their homes. The buses are needed for their daily lives.

Chiaki: Oh, I see. Now I understand why it is needed. Creating new kinds of public transportation can really make our lives easier.

Taiga: Each new kind of public transportation has its own \*purpose. I hope that new kinds of public transportation will be developed to support different areas and the people who use them.

Then, I found some interesting books there. They were about \*proverbs around the world. Each proverb taught me something important about life with a lot of \*humor. For example, in Italy, there is a proverb, "\*Quenching one's thirst with salted ham." This means making a situation worse.

Some of the books I read were about the proverbs used in Japan. My favorite one is "Three years on a stone." Do you know its meaning? It means that if you keep trying and never "give up, things will be better in the end, \*just as sitting on a cold stone for three years will make the cold stone warm.

Now, here are two proverbs with \*opposite meanings. The first one is "If you do not enter the tiger's \*cave, you will not catch its \*cub." This means that you need to take action to \*succeed even when you feel that it is not safe. The other one is "\*Knocking on a stone bridge before you cross it." I think it means that it is important to be very careful when you try to do something.

The library near my house does not have comic books, so I read these other books instead. They were interesting, but I still think reading comic books is fun. What do you think? I know some libraries have comic books. Should a library have comic books?
